


Registered Nurses (RN)

Registered Nurses (RN) are licensed by the California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN). The BRN issues certificates to eligible public health nurses, nurse practitioners, nurse anesthetists, nurse midwives, and clinical nurse specialists. The BRN also maintains a list of eligible psychiatric/mental health nurse specialists. Furnishing numbers are also provided to eligible nurse practitioners and nurse midwives to administer drugs and/or devices. As of May 2012, there are 330,943 RNs with active licenses* in California.



In 2010, the University of California, San Francisco Center for Health Professions conducted a survey of 10,000 active RNs licensed by the BRN. Although this was not a mandatory survey, 6,274 RNs provided responses. Participant findings can be found on pages 2-3.




