**NOTICE OF INTENT TO AWARD**

For Request for Application 12-4500

It is the intent of the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) to award **\$346,741** to the following **26 organizations** in response to the Health Careers Training Program (HCTP) Mini-Grants Request for Application 12-4500 (RFA):

**Awards for Category A: Healthcare Career Conferences and/or Workshops****Organization/Program: Mt. San Antonio College – “Mt SAC Health Professions Conference”****Amount Awarded: \$10,350****County Served: Los Angeles County****Participants to be served: 1100**

Will assist college student's exploration and preparation for health careers and identify available educational resources that will help them reach their professional goals.

Will empower high school students, most of who reside in underserved communities, the opportunity to explore health care careers in supportive network of other students and professionals with similar career interests.

**Organization/Program: California State University, Los Angeles – “Health Careers Advisement Office High School to College Readiness (HiSCORE) Program”**

**Amount Awarded: \$15,000**

Will serve selected students in an intensive SAT preparation course and additional students in health professions-related workshops and Health Center Fair activities planned throughout the year.

**Organization/Program: Health Sciences High School and Middle College – “Pathway to Healthy Transitions”**

**Amount Awarded: \$15,000**

**Participants to be served: 380**

Will focus on enhancing the health pathway leading to Registered Medical Assistance Certification and creating access to the entire health career ladder, an industry recognized certification and a marketable job seeking resume for the participants.

Will expand internship opportunities for at-risk youth by developing a strong partnership with Youth Bridge, a health careers internship program at Alta Bates Summit Hospital and strengthening the partnership with Alameda County's Public Health Solutions to expose students to Public Health principles and provide field-placement internships.

**Organization/Program: Model Neighborhood Program at Alameda Health System - “Model Neighborhood Program at Alameda Health System”**

**Participants to be served: 125**

Will support the Model Neighborhood Program which was developed to inspire low-income, underrepresented youth populations to become healthy and productive participants within their community and to support their transition to adulthood through the exploration of careers; focusing on health and the health care industry.

**Organization/Program: Huckleberry Youth Programs – Huckleberry Wellness Academy – Marin**

**Amount Awarded: \$15,000**

**County Served: Marin**

**Participants to be served: 155**

Will recruit a new cohort of sophomore participants for their comprehensive health career pipeline program next year and develop activities for an additional cohort of youth in their freshman year of high school.

**Organization/Program: Antelope Valley High School - “AAV Virtual Health Science Pathway”**

**Amount Awarded: \$13,300**

**County Served: Los Angeles**

**Participants to be served: 105**

Consists of courses that will provide high school students with the education and skills needed to successfully complete a post-secondary healthcare program and/or access entry level positions in healthcare professions.

**Organization/Program: UC Davis Health System - “Family Medicine Institute of Leadership for Youth”**

**Amount Awarded: \$15,000**

**Participants to be served: 50**

Will introduce youth to the career opportunities in family medicine and primary care through tours of the UC Davis Health Systems facilities, hands on demonstrations which include exercises aimed at building leadership skills, and working in groups to develop an intervention for a health need that affects their community.

**Organization/Program: White Memorial Medical Center “Health Career Exploration Through Volunteer Experience at White Memorial Medical Center”**

**Participants to be served: 100**

Will provide hospital-based volunteer experiences with an emphasis on primary care roles and responsibilities for low-income Latino students that reside in the Boyle Height/East Los Angeles communities.

**Amount Awarded: \$14,953**

**County Served: Fresno**

**Participants to be served: 100**

Will target students from disadvantaged backgrounds and help strengthen their scholastic performance to levels commensurate with admission into college as health career majors.

*Partnering with: California State University, Fresno; Fresno Unified School District (Sunnyside High School), Selma Unified School District (Caruthers High School)*

**Organization/Program: Diversity in Health Training Institute – “Health Career Pathways Project”**

**Amount Awarded: \$14,000**

**County Served: Alameda, Contra Costa**

**Participants to be served: 60**

Will create training opportunities in health care settings that allow participants to improve their employment options and communication skills for health care professions in Alameda and Contra Costa Counties.

*Partnering with: The English Center, Alameda County Medical Center, Chabot College*

**Organization/Program: Apple Valley High School – “Medical and Health Science Technology Pathway”**

**Amount Awarded: \$14,947**

**County Served: San Bernardino**

**Participants to be served: 210**

Will provide opportunities for career exploration, job shadowing, mentoring, and internships for students from Apple Valley Unified School District schools. Students are exposed to varied careers in health care through guest speakers, industry tours, college tours, mentoring and CERT training.

**Organization/Program: University of California, Riverside, School of Medicine – “Future Physician Leaders Program”**

**Amount Awarded: \$15,000**

Will create a year-round mentorship program designed to stimulate interest among students in becoming physician leaders who serve their communities with social responsibility.

Will expand Tulare Health Careers Academy for students who are pursuing a healthcare career to include hands-on internship opportunities and direct interaction with healthcare professionals in Primary Care Careers.
